The CIC/UPS Scholarships Program has made a private college education possible for more than 21,000 low-income, first generation, and minority students.

## **Grant to ACI from Illinois Tools Works Foundation**

ITW Foundation, Glenview, Illinois, awarded \$10,000 to ACI's Peer Mentoring Program. The program operates on 11 ACI-affiliated campuses. It works to help first-generation, low-income students through the critical first year in college, and helps them remain in college and earn degrees.

This is the seventh year the ITW Foundation has provided a grant to support the ACI Peer Mentoring Program.
