## ACI's Sept. 25 Boot Camp Explores Life in the Time of Pandemic

ACI will offer four Work and Life Skills Boot Camps during the 2020-21 academic year. The first, via Zoom on Friday, Sept. 25, from 10 a.m. until 3 p.m., will explore "Life Study and Work in the Time of Pandemic."

Open to all students enrolled at <u>ACI member institutions</u>, the boot camps specifically target low-income, first-generation and students of color. Sessions seek to deliver skills, information and networking resources that advance career development for students who may not have family members who have earned college degrees or pursued careers that require degrees. The program was launched in 2019-20, with support from a <u>Council of Independent Colleges</u> First Opportunity Partners Grant.



The Sept. 25 boot camp will feature Gabriel Ruiz, M.A., LCPC, a faculty member at Chicago Institute for psychoanalysis and a first-generation college graduate who earned his master's degree at ACI member institution **Concordia** 

<u>University Chicago</u>. Ruiz will give students strategies for identifying and managing the stress associated with the pandemic. Lynn Hazan, president of her award-winning executive search firm, will help students map their path in the current job market. Jeffrey Moss, CEO of <u>Parker Dewey</u>, will introduce students to the opportunities offered by virtual micro-internships, and Aaron Adams, partner at <u>Mentoring Complete</u>, will explain ACI's virtual Career Mentoring Program and its benefits to career development. Finally, Brian Walsh, senior manager, financial planning for SoFi, will help students navigate student loans and personal finance in uncertain times.

ACI Boot Camps scheduled for the remainder of the academic year include:

- **Friday, Nov. 13**: *Who am I, and Where am I Going?* -- How liberal arts education translates to careers and how students can develop a portfolio of skills and experiences while still in college. Financial literacy session on building credit.
- Friday, Jan. 29, 2021: *The Right Image, The Right Information* -- Interviewing skills, dressing for success, email etiquette, conforming to corporate culture and related matters. Financial literacy session on personal budgeting.
- Friday, March 26, 2021: *Technology in the Workplace, Across Careers and Industries* -- Technology skills for today's jobs and how technology shapes all industries and workplaces, how liberal arts majors can transition to technology careers and entrepreneurial opportunities. Financial literacy session on financial products and how career-launchers can begin building a nest egg.

Registration for ACI's Sept. 25 boot camp, "Life Study and Work in the Time of Pandemic," will open online the week of Sept. 7. A registration link will be sent to all career services, multicultural directors, first-generation program directors and peer mentoring campus coordinators. Now entering his senior year, Nelson says he hopes to work specifically with people living with disabilities. "I chose that major because it ties into that a lot more than other majors would," Nelson says. "I find all of that really interesting."

Nelson is the recipient of an ACI General Scholarship, a scholarship he qualified for with help from his financial advisor at Millikin, Nancy Askins. The scholarship made a world of difference. Without it, Nelson says didn't have enough funds to enroll.

## Virtual ACI Fall Conference Set for Nov. 9-12

ACI's annual Fall Conference will be a virtual event this year, with each of four tracks assigned a specific day the week of Nov. 9-12, says Constance Willoughby, ACI director of conferences and scholarships. All conference sessions will be offered via Zoom.

The conference tracks are for college and university staff working in advancement, finance, public relations and marketing, and student engagement. Two professional development general sessions will be offered in each track. A third session in each track is to be an open forum for discussion of significant topics of interest to track participants.



The tentative schedule for the Fall Conference is:

- Monday, Nov. 9, advancement: General sssions at 9 a.m., 10:15 a.m., forum at 2 p.m.
- Tuesday, Nov. 10, finance: General sessions at 9 a.m., 10:15 a.m., forum at 2 p.m.
- Wednesday, Nov. 11, public relations and marketing: General sessions at 9 a.m., 10:15 a.m., forum at 2 p.m.
- Thursday, Nov. 12, student engagement: General sessions at 9 a.m., 10:15 a.m., forum at 2 p.m.

Online registration is expected to begin on or about Monday, Oct. 19, Willoughby says.

ACI has compiled detailed data on its 27 member colleges and universities, expanding the data it has compiled for the past few years. The new information is found on ACI's "Member School Demographics," page, left, at <a href="https://acifund.org/member-school-demographics/">https://acifund.org/member-school-demographics/</a> on the ACI website.

The newly compiled information includes the number of men and women enrolled at each institution, ethnicity and Pell Grant recipients.

The Member School Demographics helps us identify potential donors who support ACI scholarships, emergency aid and programs," said Mick Weltman, ACI executive

director. "Potential donors often ask us for specific demographic information about ACI member colleges and universities."

ACI also has <u>employment data</u> on alumni of member schools, plus <u>information</u> about the financial impact of member colleges and universities, academic programs, including the most popular programs at each school, and financial aid available to students.

### **Foundation Grants Awarded to ACI**

Grants were awarded this summer to ACI from three foundations, including CME Group Foundation, ITW Foundation and McGraw Foundation.

"Foundations are a significant source of support for ACI programs," said Mick Weltman, ACI executive director. "We are grateful for the generous support provided by these longstanding partners, as well as some new partners. These funds are especially helpful as we work to support member schools and their students through the COVID-19 pandemic."

<u>CME Group Foundation</u>, Chicago, awarded a \$25,000 general operating grant to ACI, part of \$1 million in grants it awarded to organizations throughout Chicago to support education initiatives. ACI's grant is intended to support college and career success efforts.





<u>ITW Foundation</u>, Glenview, Illinois, awarded \$10,000 to ACI's Peer Mentoring Program. The program operates on 11 ACI-affiliated campuses. It works to help first-generation, low-income students through the critical first year in college, and helps them remain in college and earn degrees.

<u>McGraw Foundation</u>, Dundee, Illinois, is a longtime partner with ACI. It awarded \$95,000 to ACI, which provides the funds to member colleges and universities. The schools distribute the funds to students who have urgent and unexpected financial needs to continue their educations.

Catholic Charities of Chicago. He earned a bachelor's degree from Bradley University, Peoria, Illinois.



## Mark Biermann Begins Role as President at Blackburn College

ACI member <u>Blackburn College</u>, Carlinville, Illinois, welcomed Dr. Mark Biermann, right, to his new role as college president earlier this month. The Blackburn College Board of Trustees appointed Biermann earlier this summer, according to a college news release. He succeeded Dr. John McClusky, provost, who served as interim president since December 2019 after Dr. Julie Murray-Jensen resigned as president.

Biermann most recently was provost and executive vice president for academic affairs at Valparaiso University in Indiana, responsible for all academic programs, student affairs, retention and student success, diversity and inclusion, innovation and institutional effectiveness. Biermann also worked closely with Valparaiso's leadership to develop and implement a financial model that strengthens the university, including a \$250 million comprehensive campaign.



Mike Smiley, chair of the Blackburn College board, cited Biermann's exceptional administrative and academic background as well as his enthusiasm for Blackburn's unique student-managed Work Program among the reasons he emerged as the best possible candidate.

Prior to Valparaiso, Biermann worked in faculty positions at Whitworth College, Spokane, Washington, Buena Vista University, Storm Lake, Iowa, Houghton College in New York, and the U.S. Naval Academy, Annapolis, Maryland. Biermann was chair of the Department of Physics and Astronomy at Eastern Kentucky University, Richmond, and the inaugural dean of the School of Natural and Applied Sciences at Taylor University, Upland, Indiana. He was dean of the faculty and vice president for academic affairs at Wartburg College in Iowa.

Biermann earned a bachelor's, master's and doctoral degrees in optics from the University of Rochester in New York. He and his wife, Lois, are parents to two daughters.
