management and student life at Bluffton University, Bluffton, Ohio. He served there from 1993 to 2012. He has teaching experience at both Bluffton University and Bowling Green State University, Bowling Green, Ohio.

Fulcomer earned a bachelor's degree in English language and literature, *cum laude*, from Eastern Michigan University, Ypsilanti, Michigan, and a master's degree in college student personnel from Bowling Green State University. He earned a doctorate in higher education administration from the University of Toledo, Toledo, Ohio.

Fulcomer was chosen following a nationwide search that resulted in more than 80 candidates who applied for the position. Rockford University is one of 23 <u>ACI member colleges and universities</u>.
