Nelson is the recipient of an ACI General Scholarship, a scholarship he qualified for with help from his financial advisor at Millikin, Nancy Askins. The scholarship made a world of difference. Without it, Nelson says didn't have enough funds to enroll.

Financially, things have not been easy for Nelson. Compounding the situation was the news early in his college career that his mother and brothers were homeless, while he was at school. "It definitely affected me," Nelson says. "I wanted to drop out and get a job so I could go back home and help. But I knew that wouldn't be the best thing for me. And my Mom knew that me staying here and me getting a degree, I'd be able to help them a lot more if I did that, rather than leaving." Fortunately, the family situation has since improved. Nelson's mother is working again, and she and his brothers have moved to South Dakota.

"Last year, I was getting emails about how I could go be disenrolled," he says because of his financial situation. "Me getting that scholarship definitely helped me, big time. I wouldn't even be here right now without it." Plus, remaining in school will also give him the ability to help him take care of his family, he says.

After college, Nelson says he is thinking about seeking a certification in recreational therapy. He is already a certified personal trainer. Nelson is a long-distance and cross-country runner at Millikin, something he's been doing since grade school. He also works at Decatur Indoor Sports Center in the fitness department. After he finishes his education, Nelson says he's interested in working somewhere in Georgia, a place he has visited and appreciates.
